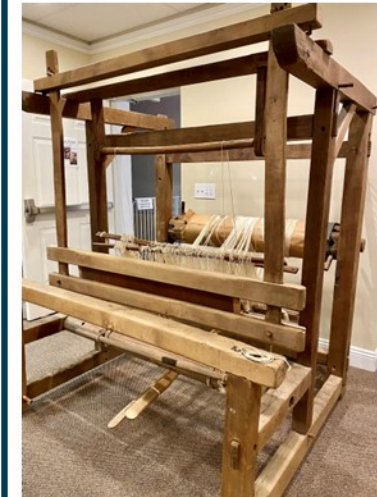

The Granville Historical Society Museum is pleased to announce new exhibits for the 2022 season. From *Textiles & Clothing* to *Mechanics & Tinkerers*, exhibits cover topics ranging from local fashion to local inventions.

Water Powered Industries features early Granville industries such as the iron furnace, sawmill and woolen mill. This exhibit is accompanied with photographs, maps and working models to demonstrate how manufacturing worked. The interactive component of this exhibit combines history with hands-on learning that is great for all ages.



For more recent local history, the **Granville Business** exhibit highlights the variety of stores and services offered in Granville, along with the craftsmanship and creativity that went into their goods. A photography studio, gun shop, and drug store are some of the places that can be explored in this exhibit. Products from Cunard's Jewelry Store, including some items on loan from the family, are a fun display that will provide a bit of nostalgia for citizens who remember the shop when it was open.



Home Industries highlights how early Granville residents made what they needed at home. Before Amazon delivery, the mall, or even mail order, where could you get new clothes? This might require spinning yarn, weaving cloth, and sewing a pattern together. Tools and equipment needed to make everyday essentials and supplies could be found in Granville households and are displayed as part of the exhibit.
